Ristorante San Marco Privacy Policy

This privacy policy for Ristorante San Marco has been compiled to better serve those who are concerned with how their 'Personally Identifiable Information' (PII) is being used online. PII, as described in US privacy law and information security, is information that can be used on its own or with other information to identify, contact, or locate a single person, or to identify an individual in context. Please read our privacy policy carefully to get a clear understanding of how we collect, use, protect or otherwise handle your Personally Identifiable Information in accordance with our website or mobile app.

What personal information do we collect from the people that visit our website or app?

Information acquired when you Sign Up for our Newsletter, Make a Reservation, Leave a Review, or Post Comments and Photos on a Social Network are used only for the purposes that are typical and appropriate for that venue.

When do we collect information?

Ristorante San Marco receives information from you when you fill out a form, enter information on our site or when you provide us with feedback on our products or services.

How do we use your information?

Ristorante San Marco may use the information we receive from you to make your reservation, mail a purchased gift certificate, email you our newsletter, and evaluate a survey or marketing communication. We also may need to contact you regarding a reservation, etc.

How do we protect your information?

Ristorante San Marco's website is scanned on a regular basis for security holes and known vulnerabilities by the Hosting Providers in order to make your visit to our site as safe as possible.

Your personal information is contained behind secured networks and is only accessible by a limited number of persons who have special access rights to such systems, and are required to keep the information confidential. In addition, all sensitive/credit information you supply is encrypted via Secure Socket Layer (SSL) technology.

The Host Providers of AppsMoment, Listbox, Open Table, and the various Social Networks implement a variety of security measures when a user enters, submits, or accesses their information to maintain the safety of your personal information. All monetary transactions are processed through a gateway provider and are not stored or processed on our hosting servers.

Do we use 'cookies'?

- Ristorante San Marco does not use cookies for tracking purposes.
- You can choose to have your computer warn you each time a cookie is being sent, or you can choose to turn off all cookies. You do this through your browser settings. Since browser is a little different, look at your browser's Help Menu to learn the correct way to modify your cookies.
 - If you turn cookies off, some of the features that make your site experience more efficient, may not function properly.

Third-party disclosure

- Ristorante San Marco does not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer to outside parties your Personally Identifiable Information unless we provide users with advance notice.
- This does not include website hosting partners and other parties who assist us in operating our website, conducting our business, or serving our users, so long as those parties agree to keep this information confidential.

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- We may also release information when it's release is appropriate to comply with the law, enforce our site policies, or protect ours or others' rights, property or safety.
 - However, non-personally identifiable visitor information may be provided to other parties for marketing, advertising, or other uses.

Third-party links

Third-party products or services on our website do include the following: Listbox Email Sign-up for our Newsletter, Open Table for Online Reservations, and The Payment Gateway Service that Processes Credit Card Payments.. These are services that are typical of any online company and you may opt not use of any of them. Neither our Website, nor our Mobile App Softwares collect or store your personal information.

California Online Privacy Protection Act

Our Privacy Policy link includes the word 'Privacy' and can easily be found on the page specified above. You will be notified of any Privacy Policy changes in an e-mail and on our Privacy Policy Page. You can change your personal information by emailing or calling us.

How does our site handle Do Not Track signals?

We honor Do Not Track signals and Do Not Track, plant cookies, or use advertising when a Do Not Track (DNT) browser mechanism is in place.

Does our site allow third-party behavioral tracking?

It's also important to note that we do not allow third-party behavioral tracking.

COPPA (Children Online Privacy Protection Act)

When it comes to the collection of personal information from children under the age of 13 years old, the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA) puts parents in control. The Federal Trade Commission, United States' consumer protection agency, enforces the COPPA Rule, which spells out what operators of websites and online services must do to protect children's privacy and safety online. Fair Information Practices

The Fair Information Practices Principles form the backbone of privacy law in the United States and the concepts they include have played a

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significant role in the development of data protection laws around the globe. Understanding the Fair Information Practice Principles and how they should be implemented is critical to comply with the various privacy laws that protect personal information.

In order to be in line with Fair Information Practices we will take the following responsive action, should a data breach occur:

Ristorante San Marco will notify you via email or will notify you via a phone call within 1 business day.

Ristorante San Marco also agrees to the Individual Redress Principle which requires that individuals have the right to legally pursue enforceable rights against data collectors and processors who fail to adhere to the law. This principle requires not only that individuals have enforceable rights against data users, but also that individuals have recourse to courts or government agencies to investigate and/or prosecute non-compliance by data processors.

CAN SPAM Act

The CAN-SPAM Act is a law that sets the rules for commercial email, establishes requirements for commercial messages, gives recipients the right to have emails stopped from being sent to them, and spells out tough penalties for violations.

We collect your email address in order to:

• Market to our mailing list or continue to send emails to our clients after the original transaction has occurred.

To be in accordance with CANSPAM, we agree to the following:

- Not use false or misleading subjects or email addresses.
- Identify the message as an advertisement in some reasonable way.
- Include the physical address of our business or site headquarters.
- Monitor third-party email marketing services for compliance, if one is used.
- Honor opt-out/unsubscribe requests quickly.
- Allow users to unsubscribe by using the link at the bottom of each email.
